Fedora Core 3 is the latest release from the Red Hat-backed Fedora project. Red Hat uses the community-based Fedora to develop new products that will one day be included in its commercial distros.

What's in Fedora?

Fedora Core 3 delivers all the tools of previous Fedoras, with new and improved components for tighter security and a better user experience. The Fedora Core 3 distribution offers either GNOME 2.8 or KDE 3.3. You'll also find the OpenOffice.org suite, the YUM package manager, and hundreds of other applications.

HAL is Here

Fedora Core 3 unveils a new hardware model that provides a Hardware Abstraction Layer (HAL). HAL separates hardware details from the underlying system, making it easier for both users and developers to support hardware components.

System Administration

Fedora Core 3 offers an array of tools for system administration and network management. Vino (the GNOME VNC server) provides remote control of the desktop. Other enhancements include improved support for Logical Volume Management (LVM) and the ext3 file system.

Also Inside

You'll find other great applications and components inside Fedora Core, including desktop tools such as the Firefox browser and the Helix media player. Programmers will discover powerful development tools, such as GCC 3.4, Eclipse, java-gnome, gtk2-perl, and Pyrex. All users will appreciate improvements to the GRUB boot loader and the new system-config-boot-loader utility for managing the boot configuration.
