### QMail

QMail has been around for a few years with the intention of taking over from Sendmail as the best SMTP server for all your email needs.

We explain how to set up the mail server on your hardware from the first installing of the software through to setting up and configuring the system to your particular needs.

### GNU Zebra

GNU Zebra manages TCP/IP based routing protocols. It supports the BGP-4



protocol as well as RIPv1, RIPv2 and OSPFv2.
