Articles are usually about 800 words per page, although code listings and images often reduce this amount. The technical level of the article should be consistent with our typical content. Remember that Linux Magazine is read in many countries, and your article may be translated for use in our sister publications. Therefore, it is best to avoid using slang and idioms that might not be understood by all readers.

Be careful when referring to particular dates or events in the future. Many weeks will pass between the submission of your manuscript and the final copy in the reader's hands.

When submitting proposals or manuscripts, please use a subject text that helps us to quickly identify your email as an article proposal for a particular topic. Screenshots and other supporting materials are always welcome.
