KDE 3.2

The latest KDE version 3.2 provides an integrated desktop and a comprehensive set of applications that combine to create an environment that is usable for a wide variety of tasks right out of the box. In addition to the many new applications making their debut in KDE 3.2, the veteran applications have been refined and augmented generously.

KOffice 1.3

KOffice is a light-weight yet feature-rich office solution which provides a variety of filters to interoperate with other popular office suites. It includes applications such as KWord, KSpread, KPresenter, Kivio and Karbon14.

KDevelop 3.1.0

An easy to use IDE (Integrated Development Environment) for KDE. The KDevelop IDE is publicly available under the GPL and supports many programming languages such as C/C++, Java, Perl, Python and Ruby.

Qt3

Qt 3 is a C++ application development framework. It has become a standard development environment for developers who want to write (and maintain) a single source-tree and port it to multiple platforms simply by recompiling.

Gnome Office

GNOME Office is a meta-project, with the mission to co-ordinate productivity applications for the GNOME Desktop. The GNOME office suite is not defined by an arbitrary, fixed number of applications, but includes Gnumeric, AbiWord, and MrProject.
