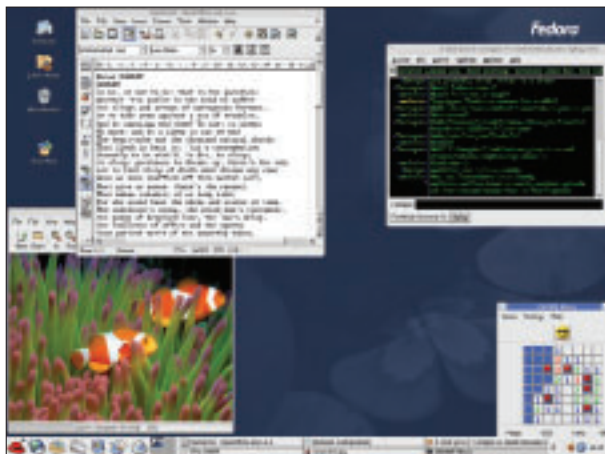
System Requirements

When the technology has proven stable enough, it will be used to build the Red Hat Enterprise Linux distribution.

Fedora is based within the community, and as such, it has community set release dates. These are expected to be about every 4 to 6 months. The Linux Magazine Fedora Core 2 DVD is the latest full release and has an estimated life expectancy of over six months.



The community is encouraged to help shape the Fedora project and so future Red Hat Enterprise offerings. The project aims are designed by Red Hat and openly developed with general participation.

Red Hat states that Fedora Core is intended to be the logical upgrade path for previous users of Red Hat Linux.

The Core 2 version of the Fedora Project contains SELinux (Security Enhanced).

Not only do we get a more secure Linux, but Fedora has changed its graphical heart. Rather than using the Xfree86 X11, Fedora Core 2 has X.org's new X11R6.7.0 windowing system. Plus the 2.6 kernel!
