

Red Hat states that Fedora Core is intended to be the logical upgrade path for previous users of Red Hat

The Core 2 version of the Fedora Proiect contains SELinux (Security Enhanced).

Not only do we get a more secure Linux, but Fedora has changed its graphical heart. Rather than using the Xfree86 X11, Fedora Core 2 has X.org's new X11R6.7.0 windowing system. Plus the 2.6 kernel!
